Members' Antics . . . What are the Odds?

Kveta and myself went with the Cootamundra Club to the Winton Historic racing weekend, which was a great weekend, with good weather, exciting racing, good company and nice evening events. Angelika was there racing the sidecar with Ray Spence, and Michael was busy keeping the machine running and tuned to perfection.

On the Saturday night our group went to the Services Club for dinner. I had a spare seat next to me, and after about 15 minutes, a good friend of Jeff Price, John Hurst, sat down next to me.

We started chatting and John asked what old cars I had. I told him that Kveta has a 31 year old Mercedes, but my interest is old bikes. He told me that he had only ever had one bike, and that it was an MV Augusta 350. I said that's funny, I currently have a 350 MV in my workshop, that I am restoring for a young guy from Goulburn.

I showed John some photos of the MV I was restoring, and he said that was the same model as his. He then showed me some photos of his, and yes, it was the same model, a GT350B, of the early 1970's.

I told John what I was currently doing with the bike, and explained that there were some scuff marks on the right hand engine case and the alloy tail-light housing, as the bike had been down on its right hand side. He said he put his bike down on the road, after hitting a patch of oil.





John said he had sold his MV in the late 1970's to a guy in Canberra. I said, this bike is from Canberra.

It had been bought by the current owner's grandfather in the late 1970's from Canberra. The grandfather had stripped the bike totally apart with the intention to fully restore it. The paintwork had been done, and a bit of engine work, but that was it. The grandfather became ill and passed away about 22 years ago.

The MV came to me in about 16 or so boxes of parts. With no workshop manual produced for these bikes, the process has not been that bad, as a large number of the components are shared with other Italian machines, making identification quite easy.

So, after much discussion and sharing of photos, John and myself believe that the MV in my workshop, is indeed the MV John owned 50 years ago. What are the odds?

Sunday 25 August: Run to Stockinbingal


